Reflections

From the Rector.....

New Year's Resolutions...

Isn't it amazing the way that moving from that last page on one calendar to the first page on a new calendar makes us want to start over? It's like being a painter in front of a blank canvas- endless possibilities await our creative input.

But we aren't the first folks to come up with this idea. In ancient Babylon they used to make promises at the beginning of the year to pay off their debts and return all of the stuff they had borrowed from their friends and neighbors (simple, yet classy). The Romans prayed to the two-faced god Janus intending to make amends for the past year and new plans for the new one. In fact, most people throughout history have found a religious or symbolic reason to start each new year with a re-dedication to a new life.

And to be honest, one has to assume that most of these resolutions met with a mix of failure and success similar to the ones we make in the 21st century. Let's face it- if the success rate of New Year's Resolutions was 100%, we wouldn't have to keep making them.

So if we know that so many of these resolutions are going to fall short of the target, does that mean we don't need to make them? Some would argue that we are setting ourselves up for failure, and that we might be better off not resolving anything.

I think that the better path is to make resolutions with the understanding that although we sometimes miss the mark, it is better to have tried and missed the bulls-eye (or often the whole target) than to simply not have tried at all. This may be due to being a life-long Episcopalian who is used to confessing

my sins on a regular basis in the context of the Eucharist and the Daily Office. It was explained to me in Confirmation class that there was almost a certainty that within mere minutes of Confession and Absolution, I (like everyone else) would find a way to move from the sinless state of grace straight back into my sinful human nature. And I would be breaking the ninth commandment if I said I hadn't found this to be rather true. (Number Nine is "Thou shalt not bear false witness," fyi.)

But therein lies the beauty of grace. Our belief that we regret our misdeeds and desire to start again coupled with God's promise of mercy and forgiveness lies at the heart of the confession and absolution found in our liturgies. In a very real sense, every time we enter this cycle we are making a new day's resolution to be the good people God calls us to be. The pressure to perfectly fulfill our promises (and the guilt which would follow as we fail to be perfect) is replaced by our re-dedication of our lives- trying to do better today than yesterday, knowing that God is there to help us and love us on the journey.

So as we enter each day of this new year, let us resolve to be aware of every new day as the new beginning it is, and to try to make our efforts each day better than the one before.

"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us." (2 Corinthians 5: 17-19)

Notes from the Associate Rector.....

On my vacation after Christmas, I began a series of reflections on my recent bout with cancer. What follows is an excerpt from one of those reflections.

When I opened up my Prayer Book last week to do the Daily Office readings for the Tuesday after Christmas, I was a little confused by the dating of the offerings and simply went straight for the Gospel gold, John 2:1-11, "The Wedding at Cana."

You perhaps remember this story. Jesus and Mary and the disciples attend a wedding at Cana. Eventually the wine runs out and Mary encourages Jesus to fix the wine shortage problem so the wedding feast can continue. Jesus at first objects to doing any such thing. What is it to him or to the world at large that these perhaps already besotted wedding guests continue to have wine to drink? But after further goading from Mary, Jesus relents and turns several jars of water into very fine wine. This is the first miracle Jesus performs in the Gospel of John, and, says the text, the act of turning the water into wine "revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him" (John 2:11). Let the celebration continue!

What exactly does this passage have to do with my cancer or my tiredness or my spiritual well-being? Well, my experience with cancer has been a very draining experience physically, and returning to work further depleted my resources, though I badly wanted to work and chose to work. Work has been my salvation many a day. However, my work now is the work of a priest, and it is not enough to go through the motions of worship and teaching

and pastoral care, to press on as if this illness has been just a little bump in the road. It was and is much, much more than that.

The wine that has kept my wedding feast going for almost sixty-six years has been depleted—the energy, the joy, the feeling of accomplishing at least a little something every single day. I am left with the water that is fairly good health, and that water is life-sustaining, physically speaking. But I want the last years of my life and ministry—the last years of my party on this earth—to be a celebration, and to celebrate one must have wine, joy, communion. For that to happen, I must enter more intensely into the life of the giver of life: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

This is my calling now, and this call I will attempt to answer, have already begun to answer in this series of reflections. The pink ribbon that now permanently adorns my wrist is my way of declaring that the battle against breast cancer is now a personal and public cause for me. On November 21, 2011, cancer went right up there alongside poverty and war and disease generally as things the world would be better off without. I am now a walking, talking anti-cancer billboard, thanks to a tattoo.

Come, Lord Jesus. Turn my life's water into wine. Amen.
