An Episcopal priest since 1988, the Rev. John Rice most recently served as pastor of Good Shepherd Episcopal Church in Hayesville, NC. Over the last eighteen years, he has led healing missions and preached in churches throughout North Carolina and the southeast. John has been involved with the Order of St. Luke as a member, chaplain, and North American Board of Directors.

John has led healing missions in churches throughout the southeast and other areas of the country. Since 2009, he has led mission teams to the northeast part of India, to train and equip clergy and lay leaders for Jesus' healing ministry. His vision for bringing OSL to India is close to bearing fruit, with plans for three chapters to be established in the fall of 2012.

John writes, "In my experience prayer, education, and training are the key elements to renewing Jesus' healing ministry in our churches. Prayer is that time to receive God's deep counsel, through listening, as well as letting ourselves become conduits of God's healing power. Education, rooted in scripture and centered on Jesus, is essential in giving church members a different understanding and reality of healing ministry in the world today. Training and mentoring for prayer ministers brings about an excellence of prayer ministry that the world so much needs. The Order of St. Luke provides a wonderful means of bringing each of these elements into the body of Christ."

Prior to becoming a priest, John worked for a number of years as an agricultural extension agent with the University of Vermont. His wife, Debra, also an Episcopal priest, is rector of St. John's Episcopal Church in Franklin, NC. They celebrated their son's marriage in December of 2010 as well as his graduation from Appalachian State University last year.

John is currently serving as OSL Region 3 Director (southeastern states and the Bahamas.) In November of 2011, he was elected President of the OSL North America Board of Directors.

He and his wife live in Hayesville, North Carolina.
